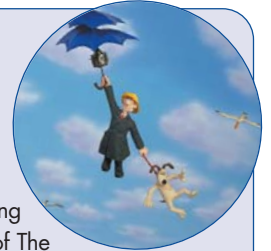

Dragon Boat Race

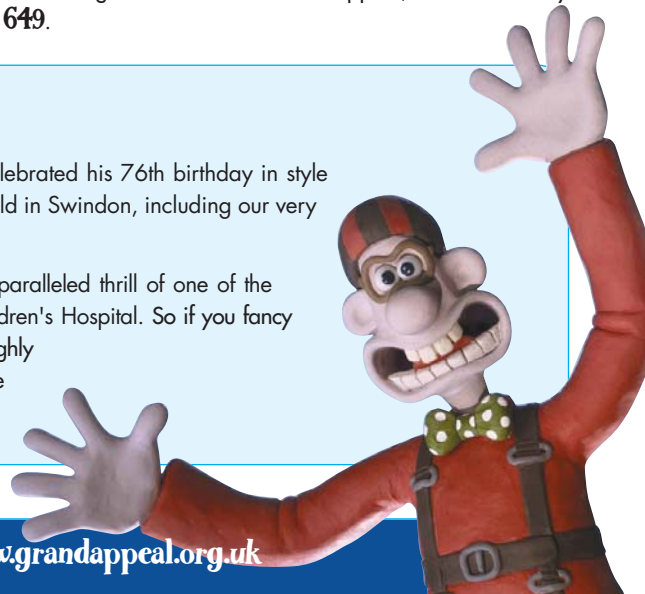
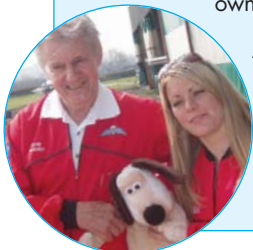

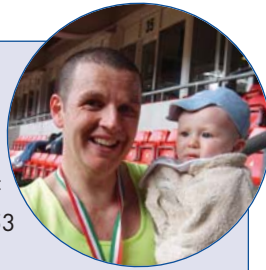

Running for Ioan

Many congratulations to Dean Williams from South Wales who ran the Cardiff Marathon last October in 3 hours and 53 minutes - not bad for a beginner!



In February 2006, Dean and his wife, Sian became proud parents of Ioan Rhys Williams. Ioan was born with a heart defect known as 'Transposition of the Great Arteries' which meant that oxygen failed to go around his body. He had no chance of survival. As a result, during the first week of his life, he had to undergo two operations – one of which was major open heart surgery.

At the Bristol Children's Hospital, nurses, doctors, consultants and surgeons in the Paediatric Intensive Care Unit and Paediatric Cardiac Ward took great care of him throughout his treatment.

As well as helping Ioan, the staff at Bristol Children's Hospital also helped Sian and Dean cope with what was a very difficult and stressful time it was reassuring to know that they could either stay at Ioan's bedside or stay in free accommodation nearby.

As a way to say a big thank you to all the staff at the hospital for saving Ioan's life, Dean decided to run the Marathon to raise money for 'The Grand Appeal'. Family, friends and colleagues have been very supportive and very generous with their donations and sponsorship and Dean raised a magnificent £4,625.

Despite a traumatic start to 2006, Ioan continues to grow stronger day by day. He is a happy, pleasant and contented boy who is enjoying life to the full. If it hadn't been for the 'miracle workers' at the Bristol Children's Hospital, it would have been a completely different story!

I was told that I would learn a lot about myself running the London Marathon and although I didn't think it would be easy, after four months of daily training I was prepared and set myself a target of 3 hours.



Everything was going well until with only seven miles to go I hit 'The Wall' and a combination of the heat, dehydration and 19 miles at a fast pace left me drained of energy, with unbelievable pain in my thighs and hamstrings. I ground to a halt and could see my ambitions slipping away.

But there was so much to keep going for - not least the knowledge that I had raised thousands of pounds for my charity of choice, The Grand Appeal. I eventually crossed the line in 3 hours 37 minutes - the last seven miles were done at half the speed I had managed for the first three quarters of the race.

Would I change anything? Not a bit of it. I went for broke and, although it didn't pay off, I made it to the finish line and found out a lot about myself in the process.

Would I do it again? Sure, why not? It's been an amazing journey and one which I've learned a lot from - not only about myself but also about humanity in general. I would definitely recommend it.

PICU Consultants swap their stethoscopes for cycling shorts in The Grand Bike Ride!



From 15th to 23rd September, a team of consultants from the paediatric intensive care unit (PICU) at Bristol Children's hospital - are gearing up for the 950 mile end-to-end cycle ride from Lands End to John O' Groats as part of a fundraising challenge to raise money for the ward. The Grand Ride team aims to raise over £20,000 in sponsorship to help fund life-saving equipment to treat young patients in intensive care.

The money raised will help fund new medical equipment for the ward, including a new transport monitor that can save lives by providing critical information on a patient's condition at the scene of an emergency, enabling immediate and life-saving decisions to be taken. It will also go towards a new baby life support machine to treat babies following open heart surgery and other critically ill babies in need of life support.

The Doctors will also be joined by a group of over 30 cyclists from property agency Savills who have nominated the Appeal as their charity of the year. Savills aim to raise £10,000 for the ward.

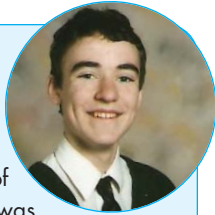
The team includes: Professor Andy Wolf, Dr David Grant, Sandra Batchelor, Richard Downes, Dr David Grier and Dr James Fraser.

Andy and his team are urging people to show their support by sponsoring the challenge. They are also seeking sponsorship in kind to provide essential items including a van to transport supplies en route. (The intensive care unit at Bristol Children's Hospital treats some of the most critically-ill children in the country, providing specialist care for around 700 patients each year. Babies and children from across the region are looked after following open heart surgery and other major operations, following accidents and treated for life threatening conditions including meningitis, asthma and other chest infections. PICU also provides a 24 hour rapid response team that can be dispatched within just 20 minutes of an emergency call being made from anywhere in the South West. The team answers an emergency call almost daily.)

Daniel's story



'Our Daniel liked computers and gadgets, he often visited Laserquest Swindon and he had lots of friends. But sadly, in October 2006 he was diagnosed with cancer and was admitted to Bristol Childrens Hospital where he spent his 18th Birthday for which he received a Laptop Computer, but the internet signal was poor. So he had to rely on TV'S/DVD'S for entertainment but these were in short supply.

So when Daniel lost his fight against cancer, we decided to raise money in his memory, to fund Ward 35 the Adolescent Ward with comfort items like DVD's and to improve the internet reception.

We know Daniel liked the staff who were more than helpful to him and all the family, we think our fundraising will help to make patients feel comfortable, so monies raised in his memory will benefit others who have to spend so much time in the ward.

So far, we've raised £3000 towards Daniel's Star Tribute Fund at the Bristol Children's Hospital and we're planning more fundraising all the time.'

Charlee's story



Our Daughter, Charlee Joanne was a beautiful happy little girl who always had the time for a cuddle. Charlee became ill with flu like symptoms and after taking her to the doctor, she was no better so we took her to Southmead Hospital where an Ear infection was confirmed. She was very sleepy and dazed and the next day our Daughter had a fit. Within 2 hours of this our baby was on life support with pneumococcal meningitis. Charlee was transferred to Bristol Children's Hospital Intensive Care Unit for urgent care. As soon as we got there we were told that after a brain scan our daughter was extremely ill.

All the staff at the hospital were so caring towards me, my husband Douglas and all our family. At the time I was 7 months pregnant with Charlee's baby brother Alfie. They kept us well informed and even gave us a bed for the night. The next day tests were carried out on Charlee to discover that she had nil chance of survival.

Our baby girl was with my Husband and I when she passed away on Monday 23rd October 2006, she was 11 months old. All the staff there deserve huge medals and two of the Intensive Care team even came to Charlee's funeral.

So this fundraising we are doing for the Grand Appeal and Charlee's Star Tribute Fund is our way of saying thank you for giving our daughter the dignity she deserved. We've raised around £6,000 so far and we're not stopping there.

Our baby was too special for this world so a star in the sky sounds perfect.

She will always be remembered by a lot of people.'

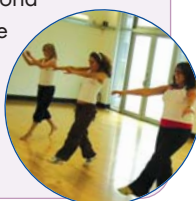

The Grand Appeal's Guardian Angels

Every year the Bristol Children's Hospital treats over 70,000 children from Bristol and all over the South West of England. Patients in the Hospital receive the very best medical care and treatment possible, but NHS funding alone cannot meet the complex and demanding needs of patients and their families, that is why we need your help.

How your support can make a difference...

£25 helps provide a family with a room for 1 week in the hospital's family accommodation unit when their child is sick in hospital and they have no where to stay.

£70 helps provide an anatomical doll to help explain treatments to a young patient, to allow them to ask questions and understand what is happening.

£120 helps provide a play specialist for 1 day. Play is very important to help children adapt to any difficulties they may have resulting from hospitalisation, to make the experience less traumatic.

£500 will purchase an Apnoea Alarm to support babies and children with breathing difficulties.

£2500 will help buy a new temporary heart pacemaker used to treat babies and children immediately following open heart surgery.

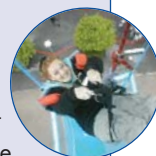
